ORDER OF VOLUNTARY DETENTION

Boal, M.J.

The defendant, Catherine Greig, is charged in a complaint with harboring and concealing a fugitive in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1071. An initial appearance was held on June 24, 2011 at which time the government moved for detention pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §§ 3142(f)(2)(A) and 3142(f)(2)(B).

After a July 11 and 13, 2011 hearing on probable cause and detention, the defendant, represented by counsel, elected to voluntarily consent to detention without prejudice.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED that the defendant be DETAINED pending trial, and is further ORDERED that:

(1) the defendant be committed to the custody of the Attorney General for confinement in a corrections facility separate, to the extent practicable, from persons awaiting or serving sentences or being held in custody pending appeal;

(2) the defendant be afforded reasonable opportunity for private consultation with counsel; and

(3) on order of a court of the United States or on request of an attorney for the government, the person in charge of the corrections facility in which the defendant is detained

and confined deliver the defendant to an authorized Deputy United States Marshal for the purpose of any appearance in connection with a court proceeding.

This order is without prejudice to the defendant filing a motion to consider the issue of pre-trial detention. Indeed, at the hearing on July 13, 2011, the defendant indicated that she intended to present additional material for consideration by this Court regarding her proposed conditions of release. Once the defendant submits such material, the government shall file a response within three business days. The defendant may seek review of this order by filing a motion for revocation or amendment pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3145(b).
